

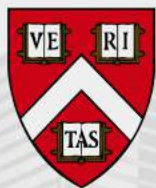

1. Challenge – Identifying problems & barriers
2. Philosophy – Analyzing frameworks
3. Solution – Implementing tools

# Socio-emotional

Challenge: Desire

Philosophy: “People don’t care what you know until they know that you care.” - Theodore Roosevelt

“People won’t always remember what you say, but they’ll always remember the way you make them feel.” – Maya Angelou

“Come to me” vs. “Go to them” (\*all industries and agencies)

Solution: Connection (the vibe)

# Pedagogical

Challenge: 5-hour classes

Philosophy: “The mere imparting of information is not education. The effort must result in one’s ability to think and do for himself.” – Carter G. Woodson

Learning is not transactional, it’s experiential.

- Information vs. experimentation
- This is why students tend to favor math and science

Solution: Creative conversations (problem solving & proximity)
